

Interrupted Nine Patch

This quilt is block based, meaning that it is made with one block repeated. You can make your quilt whatever size you'd like. Each block will finish at 9" square. The quilt as shown above is 6 blocks x 8 (48) blocks and finishes at 54" x 72"

The fabric requirements below are to make 1 block. Bring enough fabric squares to make at least 4-6 blocks (36-54 squares.)

For each 9-patch:

(9) 3 1/2" squares per block. In my quilt, I used all solids in a variety of colors. I did not use the traditional 9 patch layout of 2 colors. The only constant was 1 grey square (any value) in each 9-patch. You can choose to make your color palette as crazy or as controlled as you'd like.

"Interrupter" fabric: 1/4 yard or 1 fat quarter will be enough for 8-9 blocks. In my quilt, I used black solid fabric.

Alternate Size 14" block:

(9) 5" squares per block (charm squares are perfect for this!) A 5 x 7 (35 block) layout will give you a quilt size of 70" x 98".

1/2 yard of "interrupter" fabric will give you enough for 8-9 blocks.

Remember, you can make as many blocks as you'd like!
